\* After 45 days may apply to the Division of Vehicles for RESTRICTED driving privileges with an ignition interlock. Restrictions limit places of travel. See KSA 8-1015.

\*\* Any person subject to the 10-year interlock order may petition any district court (does not have to be the convicting district court) for relief after five years. The court may consider, without limitation, whether the person's driving privileges have been suspended, restricted or disqualified by the Division of Vehicles or by a court, and that the person has maintained the interlock for at least five years.

\*\*\* The first occurrence test failure (.08 - <.15)/conviction provisions are effective until July 1, 2015. Effective July 1, 2015, a person in this category would be restricted pursuant to KSA 8-292 or by ignition interlock upon that person's request.
